	<p>DIES PhD Program are mutually integrated, thanks to an interdisciplinary method of analysis and critical reading of economic and social phenomena, with particular attention to the perspective of European integration and economic and social internationalization.</p> <p>The aim of the PhD Program is to provide the PhD students with professional skills and abilities that allow them a better understanding of the complex contexts in which experts in the humanities, law and social sciences are called upon to operate today.</p> <p>According to the ANVUR regulation for the accreditation and evaluation of innovative PhD Programs, every PhD student of the international curriculum is required to spend a research stay at a foreign university or research institution for a period of not less than 3 months and not more than 18 months.</p> <p>Foreign students can spend the aforementioned research stay at an University or a Research Institution in their home country.</p>

<p>Evaluation of academic qualifications and proposal of a research project</p>	<p>The evaluation of academic qualifications and research project is expressed in analytical form by the Selection Board for a maximum of 100 points on the basis of the assessment of the following elements produced by the PhD candidate:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - university curriculum (up to 30 points); - publications, including the thesis (up to 10 points); - any other qualifications consistent with the profile for which you are competing (up to 10 points); - proposal of a research project that the candidate would like to develop during the PhD course. In the case of the admission to the course, the proposal is not committing to the extent of the activities the candidate has to develop during the course frequency (up to 50 points). <p>The candidate obtaining a minimum of 35/50 for the project evaluation and at least 60/100 for the total evaluation are admitted to the oral examination</p>
<p>Oral Examination by video conferencing</p>	<p>The oral examination, in video conferencing, will be held on September 23, 2020 at 10.30 am according to the procedures that will be communicated to the admitted candidates.</p> <p>It will be based on the assessment of knowledge in the subjects of the disciplinary scientific area of the PhD Program as well as on the discussion about the academic qualifications and the</p>

research project produced by the candidate.

Furthermore, the knowledge by the candidate of at least one foreign language of the European Union other than the one of the oral examination will be assessed.

The minimum score for passing the oral examination is **35 points**. The maximum score is **50 points**.

Candidates are given the opportunity to take the oral examination in English.
