Admission requirements	<p>Holding of one of the following degrees:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- post-graduate or master degree in accordance with D.M. 509/1999, as amended and supplemented;</li> <li>- degree in accordance with previous education system (at least four years program);</li> <li>- master degree equivalent from foreign Universities.</li> </ul> <hr/>
Entrance examination	<p>The entrance examination consists of two parts. The first consists in the assessment of the academic curriculum and of the research proposals of the candidate, for a maximum score of 40/100. The second is an oral exam, for a maximum score of 60/100.</p> <p>The oral examination is regarded as passed if the applicant achieves at least 35/60 marks. The applicant is required to prove a good command of the English language.</p> <p>In the oral examination the student shall prove knowledge of the following subjects:</p> <p>Macroeconomics</p> <p>Microeconomics</p>

	<p>Foreign applicants will be allowed to take the oral exam by conference call.</p> <p>The final score is expressed in hundredth (100/100).</p> <p>The final ranking of successful candidates will result from the sum of the marks awarded to the assessment of curriculum and proposal, and to the exam.</p>
