Educational aims	The PhD Course in "Euro(pean)-languages and Specialized Terminologies", in collaboration with Université d'Artois (Arras (France), aims to highlight, from an interdisciplinary perspective, the role played by European languages and specialized terminologies in the fields of law and economy, sociology, maths and finance as well as in the agricultural-food sector, with particular reference to the technical vocabulary pertaining to each subject. The development of a language can be evaluated through the evolution of its vocabulary, since the emergence of new realities/concepts entails the creation of new linguistic tools for the study and management of increasingly complex textual typologies. The PhD Course thus fosters a specialized study of European languages, cultures and literatures, with the objective of designing and promoting international linguistic policies through the creation of innovative terminological products in the field of technical and scientific communication. In particular, the PhD Course aims to develop the research on foreign languages in a diachronic perspective; carry out monolingual and/or multilingual studies in relevant fields of study; further the knowledge of the application sector and provide the terminological skills necessary to train experts in the field. A period abroad is obligatory (number minimum of months n. 3).

Selection	Interview in the foreign language (English or French) chosen by the candidate (minimum score: 50; maximum score: 85).
