Educational Goals and Objectives	<p>The PhD course aims to enable participants to develop theoretical and methodological knowledge, in a multidisciplinary approach, on the topic of the relationship between law and service sector, with particular attention to the legal framework of the services, due to their increasing differentiation and the role undertaken in contemporary economies. Several scientific-disciplinary areas of legal field are involved: private law and private comparative law, commercial law, constitutional law, public law, tax law, international law, European Union law, philosophy of law. The program envisages in the first two years the compulsory attendance of lectures and seminars on specific subjects of the course (companies and contracts which have as their subject matter the provision of services, consumer protection, services of general economic interest and content and limits of the so called universal services, services law in the health and logistic sector, tourism law, digital services and big data, media and telecommunications law, tax system related to innovative and technological services, European framework concerning Freedom of establishment and freedom to provide services, contracts related to international services, comparative analysis between different systems, ways of protection of rights affected during the provision of services). The course will continue during the third year with an intensive research activity, placed side by side with the participation in thematic seminars.</p> <p>In addition, the PhD program provides some lectures and seminars to be held in English.</p> <p>PhD students will be also encouraged to spend minimum three months in foreign universities or foreign research institutions, in particular those which are part of the consortium, by using the resources allocated for these activities (eg. extra money for abroad experiences), whether for research or training activities).</p>

Participation Requirements	Possession of one of the following qualifications: Master's Degree (Laurea Magistrale) or a unique cycle Master's Degree or an equivalent title.
Curriculum evaluation	Titles evaluated: - final grade of the degree (up to a maximum of 3 points: final grade of 110 summa cum laude (highest honours) will confer 3 points; 110-109: 2 points; 108-105: 1 point); - postgraduate titles (up to a maximum of 2 points), - scientific publications (up to a maximum of 5 points). For the candidates who will discuss their thesis after the evaluation of the titles and by 31 October 2019, the evaluation of the University career will be as follows: average exam score from 29 to 30: 3 points; from 28 to 28.99: 2 points; from 27 to 27.99: 1 point

<p>Research project</p>	<p>Evaluation of the research project (to be sent together with the application within the deadline above mentioned) that the candidates would follow during the PHD program and in line with the scientific sectors and topics included in the program. Candidates are also requested to mention the Scientific Sector mainly involved in their own research project. The research project (not exceeding 15.000 characters, spaces included) should not be meant as compulsory with reference to their final research. Candidates who achieve a final evaluation of at least 18/30 are admitted to the oral exam.</p>
<p>Oral test</p>	<p>Oral admission test: The oral exam will be focused on the research project and on the fundamentals and basic principles of the scientific sector mainly involved in the research project (eg. private law, public law, etc.)</p> <p>The oral admission test will be held remotely (via Microsoft-Teams Platform). Date: September 28<sup>th</sup> at 10.00 a.m.</p> <p>The oral exam will be considered passed with a score of at least 36/60. The candidate must also demonstrate a good knowledge of a foreign language (English, French or Spanish).</p>
