Formative Objectives	<p>The PhD program aims to train experts, scholars and highly professional operators, able both to understand the story of the complex system of legal systems for the government and the regulation of economic phenomena – both to know the operational tools - legal, economic-business and political - through which social actors and organizations interact, mutually and with public authorities, for the protection, guarantee and affirmation of individual and collective interests and prerogatives.</p> <p>The multiple teaching and research methodologies flowing into the DIES doctoral project are mutually integrated, thanks to an interdisciplinary method of analysis and critical reading of economic phenomena-with particular attention to the European and international dimension of research, the prospect of European integration, economic and social internationalization and in line with some of the fields of research and innovation identified by the National Research Programme (PNR) 2021-2027 as well as the goals indicated in the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.</p> <p>The aim of the doctorate is to provide course participants with professional skills and abilities that allow a better understanding of the complexity of the contexts in which today are called to operate the human and social sciences experts in the legal field, administrative and managerial, encouraging multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary dialogue, as well as the constant confrontation between the scientific world and that of companies and professions.</p> <p>Subject to the specific provisions on additional grants and industrial doctorates, each PhD student is required to spend a period of time at a foreign university or research institution for a period of not less than 6 months and not more than 18 months.</p>

Requirements to apply to the Phd Course selection	<p>Possession of one of the following qualifications:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Master’s Degree or Master’s Degree obtained pursuant to D.M. 509/1999 and subsequent amendments and additions; - Degree or Diploma obtained in accordance with previous educational systems (whose legal course lasts at least four years); - Equivalent academic qualification obtained at foreign universities. <p>In case of qualifications obtained at foreign universities, if the qualification has not already been declared equivalent to the Italian qualification requested, admission to the competition is subject to the recognition of the qualification, for the sole purpose of admission to the course, by the Selection Board.</p>

Title evaluation	<p>The evaluation of the qualifications shall be expressed in an analytical form by the Selection Board for a maximum of 50 points based on the assessment of the following elements submitted by the candidate:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - university curriculum (up to 30 points); - publications, including thesis (up to 10 points); - any other securities consistent with the profile for which you are competing (up to 10 points)
Research evaluation	<p style="text-align: center;">Project</p> <p>This test will consist in the evaluation of the research project that the candidate intends to carry out within the framework of the doctorate, in any case not binding for the purpose of the activity that the PhD student will actually have to carry out in case of admission to the course. The minimum score for passing the test is 35 points. The maximum score attributable to the research project is 50 points</p>
Oral exam	<p>The oral test will be held on 13 September 2023 at the Department of Law at 10.30 am</p> <p>The oral exam will be based on the assessment of knowledge in the subjects of the disciplinary scientific area of the doctoral course.</p> <p>During the test it will also be ascertained the good knowledge of at least one foreign language of the European Union other than that in which the oral test is held.</p> <p>The minimum score for passing the oral test is 35 points. The maximum score attributable to the oral test is 50 points.</p> <p>Candidates are allowed to take the oral exam in English.</p> <p>Candidates are also given the opportunity to take the oral exam electronically.</p>
