Specific requirements for the positions with special scholarships under DM 118	<p>1) TOPIC PNRR: <i>The impact of sector authorities’ regulatory and supervisory powers in the application of National Recovery Plan measures on private contractual autonomy and the related consequences on the position of market operators and consumers.</i></p> <p>The investigation is aimed to verify the contribution made by the sector authorities to supervise, regulate and impose the application of the National Recovery Plan measures in all the subjects concerned, with particular reference to the impact on private contractual autonomy and on the market, for the protection of consumers and market operators.</p> <p>Moreover, the investigation is aimed to assess whether the pursuit of the goals of the National Recovery Plan may entail new or more incisive tools of control and compression of private autonomy by sector authorities, with a consequent impact on civil law categories.</p> <p>Candidates running for this special scholarship under DM 118 must declare that they are aware that the PhD programme includes <u>six months abroad</u>. Moreover, they must <u>submit a Research Project, within the deadline above mentioned, under penalty of exclusion</u> (see below “Evaluation of the research project”)</p> <p>2) TOPIC PNRR: <i>The role of competition rules, on the implementation of the National Recovery Plan, with particular reference to European law issues and its effects on national law.</i></p> <p>Competition is one of the 'enabling reforms' of the National Recovery Plan (pp. 81-83). In line with the Plan and taking into account the rules of the European Union legal system, the research may focus on the analysis of one or more of the following aspects:</p>

the relationship between competition and social values (social services, health, environment) in the light of national and European Union principles and values; strategic infrastructures and concessionary regimes (ports, electricity, gas distribution, motorways, state property) and their compliance with EU rules; the enforcement of competition rules, the strengthening of antitrust powers and coordination between the European Commission and national authorities

Candidates running for this special scholarship under DM 118 must declare that they are aware that the PhD programme includes six months abroad. Moreover, they must submit a Research Project, within the deadline above mentioned, under penalty of exclusion (see below_“Evaluation of the research project”)

3) TOPIC PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION: *The legal issues underlying the adoption of digitised organisational, administrative and accounting structures in private and public companies and the related insurance coverage issues with reference to the liability of directors', managers' and auditors', exploring the related impact on corporate governance rules.*

The study of the impact of digitalisation on organisational structures has multiple interferences with the NATIONAL Recovery Plan, which explicitly states the goal of "*supporting institutional planning also through the experimentation of innovative tools of different governance models with a comparative approach among policy sectors, state and sub-state levels of government ..., which adequately take into account the opportunities given by the new information and communication technologies*".

Candidates running for this special scholarship under DM 118 must declare that they are aware that the PhD programme includes six months in a firm/public authority and six months abroad. Moreover, they must submit a Research Project, within the deadline above mentioned, under penalty of exclusion (see below_“Evaluation of the research project”).

4) TOPIC PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION: Territorial gaps and the National Recovery Plan

In order to investigate the actual capability of the Recovery Plan's implementation measures to balance our country's territorial asymmetries, the goal of the research is to sum up and interpret the related legal framework, both at national and supranational, primary and secondary level.

Moreover, they must <u>submit a Research Project, within the deadline above mentioned, under penalty of exclusion</u> (see below_“Evaluation of the research project”).</p> <p>5) TOPIC CULTURAL HERITAGE: <i>The enhancement of diffuse cultural heritage</i></p> <p>The subject of the research is the analysis of the possible developments of policies and regulations in the field of the enhancement of the cultural heritage, taking into consideration the State-region relations, with a special focus on the interventions envisaged in the measure M1C3.1 CULTURAL HERITAGE FOR THE NEXT GENERATION, in the part where it intends to promote interventions for the enhancement of small cultural sites.</p> <p>The abovementioned research should take into account the presence of an important cultural heritage spread throughout the national territory, the opening of the sector to the intangible and digital component, which has further broadened the notion of cultural heritage and at the same time the need for its protection, in a constitutional context of division of competences that requires loyal cooperation between institutional actors (State and Regions, European Union).</p> <p>Candidates running for this special scholarship under DM 118 must declare that they are aware that the PhD programme includes <u>six months in a firm/public authority and six months abroad</u>. Napoli <u>must submit a Research Project, within the deadline above mentioned, under penalty of exclusion</u> on the following topic:</p> <p>“The water service governance between sustainability requirements and effective use of the asset".</p> <p>The goal of the research is to examine the historically deficient</p>

	water service supply system through the study of the measures envisaged by the Recovery Plan, in the European, national and local spheres, in order to stimulate an improvement in the management of the service.

Educational Goals and Objectives	<p>The PhD course aims to enable participants to develop theoretical and methodological knowledge, in a multidisciplinary approach, on the topic of the relationship between law and service sector, with particular attention to the legal framework of the services, due to their increasing differentiation and the role undertaken in contemporary economies. Several scientific-disciplinary areas of legal field are involved: private law, commercial law, constitutional law, public law, tax law, criminal law, international law, European Union law, philosophy of law. The program envisages in the first two years the compulsory attendance of lectures and seminars on specific subjects of the course (companies and contracts which have as their subject matter the provision of services, consumer protection, services of general economic interest and content and limits of the so called universal services, services law in the health and logistic sector, tourism law, digital services and big data, media and telecommunications law, tax system related to innovative and technological services, European framework concerning freedom of establishment and freedom to provide services, contracts related to international services, comparative analysis between different systems, ways of protection of rights affected during the provision of services). The course will continue during the third year with an intensive research activity, placed side by side with the participation in thematic seminars.</p> <p>In addition, the PhD program provides some lectures and seminars to be held in English.</p> <p>PhD students are also requested to spend minimum three months abroad (not compulsory for the position reserved to permanent employees) by using the resources allocated for these activities whether for research or training activities.</p>

The research project should not be meant as compulsory with reference to final research/thesis of the candidates</p> <p>Candidates running for ordinary scholarship must hand in a Research Project in line with one or more scientific sectors and topics included in the PHD Course program. Candidates are also requested to mention the Scientific Sector mainly involved in their own research project.</p> <p>Candidates running for positions with special scholarships under DM 118 or for positions reserved for permanent employees, must submit a brief Research Project related to the above mentioned topics (see “Specific requirements for the special scholarships under DM 118 351”, or “Specific requirements for the special scholarships for permanent employees..”).</p> <p><u>For all candidates:</u> The research project must not exceed 15.000 characters, (spaces included)</p> <p>Candidates who achieve (as regard the research project) an evaluation of at least 18/30 are admitted to the oral exam.</p> <p>The list of candidates admitted to the oral interview will be uploaded on the university website at least 1 week before the day of the interview</p>
